LEARNING

Reception: This week Reception have read a short tale called 'The Little Red Hen'. We have learnt all about farm animals and the life of a farmer. We even had a very special delivery of eggs in an incubator. We have loved watching them hatch and grow. We are looking forward to looking after them next week too! We have had lots of fun in maths this week, learning about different amounts. We have learnt how to compare amounts using the language "more than" and "fewer than". On Wednesday we explored the new OPAL areas at school, learning how to use them and look after them.

Nursery: This week, we have read a very popular story, We're Going On a Bear Hunt. The children were super excited about this story and demonstrated fantastic story retell when acting out the story. Towards the end of the week, we have introduced the celebration of Lunar New Year. We converted our role play kitchen into a Chinese restaurant, exploring money, menus and the role of a chef. As part of Tasty Tuesday, we created discussion around developing a balanced diet to maintain a healthy lifestyle. Children created exotic fruit kebabs (kiwis, pineapple, grapes & strawberries). In maths, we have continued to develop our counting skills up to 5 and using fast fingers to show the counted amount. Brave Bear Cubs have explored the traditional nursery rhyme, Incy, Wincy Spider, children have developed fantastic recall of the rhyme including some interactive

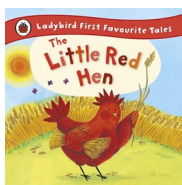

How to support your child with reading at home:

- Enjoy reading together. Find a comfortable, quiet place to read
- Make reading part of your daily routine.
- Listen to your child reads aloud daily. Try for 10 minutes.
- Read to your child, enjoying books together and showing them how an expert reads.

Questions to ask your child when reading at home:

- What do you think this book is going to be about?
- Who are the main characters?
- What do you think will happen next?
- Why did they do that?
- Do you like this book? Why?
- What was the best / funniest / saddest part of the story?
- What does the picture tell you?
