Reception: This week, Reception read the beautiful story of 'Rain Before Rainbows' by Smriti Halls. Reception have enjoyed exploring different types of weather, understanding which weather frequently occur during the four seasons. Reception have taken a particular interest in rainbows and understanding how and why rainbows appear in the sky. As this week is STEM week, we have observed and conducted multiple experiments. Our favourite was adding water to skittles then observing how the colours spread like a rainbow in the sky. In maths, we utilised a new manipulative called a 'Rekenrek'. We used the Rekenreks to help us form number bonds within 10.

Nursery: This week, we have continued our love for traditional tales, reading 'The Ugly Duckling', inspired from last week's visit from our pet chicks. We discussed the importance of caring for animals and how animals care for their young ones and explored the different names animals have for young ones. As part of STEM week this week, we have explored how things can change over time and we even became little scientists and completed some experiments of our own. The Brave Bear cub children have also been exploring different animals this week with a focus on their story of the week 'Dear Zoo'. Children have developed a fantastic range of vocabulary and compared the difference between each zoo animal.

Reminders

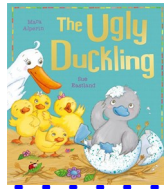
- Children in Reception should bring their school bag **EVERY** day.

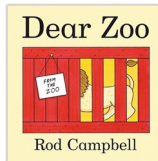

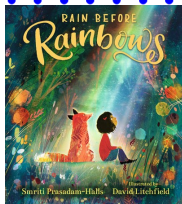

How to support your child with reading at home:

- Enjoy reading together. Find a comfortable, quiet place to read
- Make reading part of your daily routine.
- Listen to your child reads aloud daily. Try for 10 minutes.
- Read to your child, enjoying books together and showing them how an expert reads.

Questions to ask your child when reading at home:

- What do you think this book is going to be about?
- Who are the main characters?
- What do you think will happen next?
- Why did they do that?
- Do you like this book? Why?
- What was the best / funniest / saddest part of the story?
- What does the picture tell you?
